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# Foreword

# **Living Out Holy Love**

# Spiritual Well-being:

Just as physical health is important, spiritual growth is equally vital. Good "spiritual well-being" will help us establish a wonderful relationship with God, grow and mature in our spiritual lives, and strengthen our faith.

#### The Lord's Invitation:

In the face of this year's theme of "Living out Holy Love," are we willing to accept the Lord's invitation to spend at least 15 minutes each day reading, hearing, meditating, and acting out His words, thereby becoming disciples who follow His way?

#### Being Disciples of Christ:

To become healthy disciples of the Lord, we need to start with a yearning and love for His Word. Moreover, we should be willing to share our insights from reading the Bible with our small groups or other brothers and sisters, mutually encouraging one another.

#### Shared Memories:

Through the RHEMA Bible Reading Movement, we can build a shared foundation of faith, establish a sense of group identity and belonging, participate in God's story, pass on faith traditions, and strengthen the consistency of doctrine and teaching. These shared experiences and memories contribute to deepening the connection among church members and our relationship with God.

# The "Rhema" Method of Searching the Scriptures

"Rhema" is an English transliteration of the Greek word ῥῆμα (pronounced "rey-mah"), which means "word". In the New Testament, Rhema often refers to "God's Word"

"Rhema" also encapsulates John Wesley's method of searching the Scriptures, comprising 4 aspects of receiving God's Word as a means of grace for us:

Read: To read God's Word in Scripture

Hear: To hear God's Word through Scripture, sermons, and sharing from others

Meditate: To reflect on God's Word to us and how we should respond

Act: To apply God's Word in our daily life

# How can you use this booklet?

- 1. You are encouraged to set aside 15-20 minutes each day to spend time with God.
- 2. Begin each devotion with a few minutes to quieten down and centre on God.
- 3. Devotions from Monday to Saturday include a daily passage (NIV) and space in the booklet to practice the Rhema method of Searching the Scriptures: Read, Hear, Meditate, Act. Please journal your reflections.
- 4. For Sundays, the sermons in the worship services will complement the Rhema scriptural content. You may pen down your sermon notes in this booklet.
- 5. You are encouraged to gather weekly with a spiritual friend or small group to encounter the Word together, share your insights, stay accountable, support one another, and live out the Word.

What Does It Mean To Live Out Holy Love?

Day 1: 20 August 2023, Sunday

# James 1:19-27

- <sup>19</sup> My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, <sup>20</sup> because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. <sup>21</sup> Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.
- <sup>22</sup> Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. <sup>23</sup> Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror <sup>24</sup> and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. <sup>25</sup> But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.
- <sup>26</sup> Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. <sup>27</sup> Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

# Sermon Notes

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# James 1:1

<sup>1</sup> James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes scattered among the nations: Greetings.

#### Read

Read the verse at least three times slowly and carefully, word by word.

#### Hear

Listen attentively to what you are reading. As you read, which words stand out to you? If there is none, read the verse again several times.

# Meditate

- a. What does it mean to be a "servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ"? Evaluate yourself. Do you consider yourself a qualified servant of Christ? (Rate yourself on a scale of 1-10, with 10 being fully qualified.) Which areas do you need more practice?
- b. What does "scattered" refer to? Who are the Christians who are "scattered" and in need of your care and intercession?

#### Act

Pray for those who come to mind. Consider sending them text messages to show your concern and offer encouragement.

#### Pray

Our Heavenly Father, thank you for your infinite love and mercy that allows us to be part of your kingdom. Although we now live scattered in this world, we long for the bright and beautiful eternal home of the future. Help your servants around the world to be light and salt, bringing your love to a dark and broken world. In the name of Christ, we pray. Amen.

# What Does It Mean To Live Out Holy Love? Day 3: 22 August 2023, Tuesday

# James 1:2-4

<sup>2</sup> Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, <sup>3</sup> because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. <sup>4</sup> Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

#### Read

Read the Scripture passage slowly and carefully, paying attention to each word.

#### Hear

What qualities of the spiritual life do you hear in this passage? Which ones do you need to work on?

#### Meditate

In your experience of caring for and loving people, have you ever suffered the price of perseverance? Have you encountered great joy from the Lord in the process or outcome of those experiences?

### Act

Pray for a blessing upon those whom you find difficult to love.

# Pray

Lord Jesus, even when You suffered greatly on the cross, You still prayed for Your persecutors. Lord, help us always to remember that we are sinners who have done nothing to earn Your grace, and we have no reason to boast. Help us to show love and patience when we interact with people who have different personalities, ideas, and styles, remembering that they are also loved by the Father. We love because You first loved us. When we are weak, intolerant and unloving, aid us and empower us to change. Amen.

# James 1:5-8

<sup>5</sup> If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. <sup>6</sup> But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. <sup>7</sup> That person should not expect to receive anything from the Lord. <sup>8</sup> Such a person is double-minded and unstable in all they do.

#### Read

Read the passage aloud.

#### Hear

Imagine James speaking to you face to face. Read the passage again and listen carefully to the will of God.

# Meditate

What has caused you to question God's love for you? Have you ever complained that God has put you in difficult situations with certain people?

#### Act

Talk to God in prayer about your doubts and difficulties. If you still harbour negative feelings or resentment towards someone, pray and ask the Holy Spirit to resolve them.

# Pray

Heavenly Father, we need Your love to be poured out into our hearts and lives. Help us to be confident that the hurts we have suffered, the relationships we have messed up, and the ignorance we have showed will not separate us from Your love. Teach us that You have a good purpose for every person we encounter and every circumstance we face. In the name of Christ, we pray. Amen.

# What Does It Mean To Live Out Holy Love? Day 5: 24 August 2023, Thursday

# James 1:9-15

- <sup>9</sup> Believers in humble circumstances ought to take pride in their high position. <sup>10</sup> But the rich should take pride in their humiliation—since they will pass away like a wild flower. <sup>11</sup> For the sun rises with scorching heat and withers the plant; its blossom falls and its beauty is destroyed. In the same way, the rich will fade away even while they go about their business.
- <sup>12</sup> Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him.
- <sup>13</sup> When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; <sup>14</sup> but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. <sup>15</sup> Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.

#### Read

Read the Scripture passage aloud.

#### Hear

What is God saying to you through these verses?

## Meditate

What are trials and temptations? What mindset does God want us to have when we face them? How are we to hold on to our love for God and others in the midst of trials and temptations?

#### Act

Recite verse 12. If you know someone who needs encouragement in this area, consider sharing the verse with them.

#### Prav

O God, you promise that those who love you and endure trials will receive the crown of life from you. Just as the Lord Jesus went through great trials because of His love and ultimately triumphed over death, help us to fix our eyes on Christ, not prioritizing the lusts of the flesh, the lusts of the eyes, or the pride of life. Holy Spirit, guard our hearts so that we can love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength, and love others as ourselves. Lord, have mercy on us. Amen.

# James 1:16-21

<sup>16</sup> Don't be deceived, my dear brothers and sisters. <sup>17</sup> Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. <sup>18</sup> He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of first fruits of all he created.

<sup>19</sup> My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, <sup>20</sup> because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. <sup>21</sup> Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.

# Read

What is the emphasis in this passage? Circle the words that you think are important.

#### Hear

Read the passage aloud again and listen carefully to God's heart.

## Meditate

What mindset does Scripture remind us to have when encountering unexpected situations or when encountering people or things that are not to our liking?

## Act

Human anger does not fulfil the righteousness of God. Exercise: When confronted with a situation or person that makes you angry, pause and, while regulating your breathing, meditate on the following: be quick to hear, slow to speak, and slow to anger.

# Pray

O heavenly Father, You are the unchanging One and Your lovingkindness never changes. Every good gift and every blessing comes from You. We thank and praise you for you have created and intended us for good. Father, help us in our daily lives to do all things and treat all people in ways that are pleasing to you, and to do so with Christlikeness. In Christ's precious name, we pray. Amen.

# What Does It Mean To Live Out Holy Love?

Day 7: 26 August 2023, Saturday

# James 1:22-27

<sup>22</sup> Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. <sup>23</sup> Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror <sup>24</sup> and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. <sup>25</sup> But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

<sup>26</sup> Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless.<sup>27</sup> Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

#### Read

What words appear repeatedly? Please circle them.

#### Hear

Read the passage again slowly and aloud, noting the feelings in your heart.

#### Meditate

What does the passage say about being "religious" in God's eyes? Reflect on your own words and actions. Where do you need to be more careful and diligent in practicing them?

# Act

Pray to God every day for strength to walk in His ways, and ask the Holy Spirit to help you be aware of the needs of those around you (friends, family, strangers, and especially the vulnerable) and to do what you can to help them.

# Pray

Dear God, You desire Your people to walk in Your ways and live out Your will. Remind us by Your Spirit not to be satisfied with the joy and knowledge that we have been justified by faith, but to continue striving for a perfect life through sanctifying grace, loving God and others. Lord, You have compassion on the world, and even more compassion and mercy on the lonely and the helpless. May we all be sensitive to Your heart and learn to be like the Lord Jesus, willingly and humbly paying the price to care for and help others. In the Holy Name of the Lord, we pray. Amen.

#### Read

What is the message conveyed in this passage? What warnings does it provide?

#### Hear

What is God saying to you through this passage?

#### Meditate

Have you encountered situations where you showed "special attention" or "become judges with evil thoughts"?

# Act

Approach God in prayer, reflecting on your thoughts and the outcomes of your reflections.

# Pray

Righteous and merciful Lord, help me! May I never show favouritism or hold biased or judgmental attitudes towards others. Instead, help me imitate Christ and treat everyone with compassion and kindness. Lord, grant me the mind of Christ, enable me to put off the old self and put on the new self, and guide me to always speak and act in ways that edify others. I pray in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

# James 2:5-7

<sup>5</sup> Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him? <sup>6</sup> But you have dishonoured the poor. Is it not the rich who are exploiting you? Are they not the ones who are dragging you into court? <sup>7</sup> Are they not the ones who are blaspheming the noble name of him to whom you belong?

# Read

What do you observe from this passage? How does it describe the people chosen by God?

#### Hear

What is God speaking to you through this passage?

#### Meditate

Reflect on your treatment of the poor. Have you humiliated or discriminated against them? Have you ever experienced oppression from the wealthy? Consider God's perspective on these situations.

# Act

Take action and treat the poor and the wealthy with equality. Seek fairness and justice, treating everyone with love and respect regardless of their economic status. Strive to avoid discrimination, prejudice, and blasphemy towards God.

## Pray

Heavenly Father, thank you for choosing the poor to be rich in faith and inherit your kingdom. Forgive us for any humiliation towards the poor and help us see others as you do. Teach us to value people over possessions and use us to support those in need. May we reflect your love through acts of kindness and mercy. In Jesus' name, Amen.

How Does Holy Love Look Like In My Relationships? Day 11: 30 August 2023, Wednesday

# James 2:8-13

<sup>8</sup> If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right. <sup>9</sup> But if you show favoritism, you sin and are convicted by the law as lawbreakers. <sup>10</sup> For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it.<sup>11</sup> For he who said, "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." If you do not commit adultery but do commit murder, you have become a lawbreaker.

How does this passage discuss the "law"? What ultimately triumphs?

#### Hear

What is God speaking to you through this passage?

## Meditate

How can I apply the teachings of this passage to my daily life?

# Act

Starting today, approach things with a heart of mercy.

# Pray

O Lord, You are the One who shows mercy to others. I acknowledge that I cannot fully fulfil the requirements of the law. I understand that only a heart of mercy can triumph over the judgement of the law. Therefore, I pray that You will grant me a compassionate heart, that I may live my life with love as the starting point and bear witness to the glory of the Lord. I pray in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

# James 2:14-17

<sup>14</sup> What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? <sup>15</sup> Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. <sup>16</sup> If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? <sup>17</sup> In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.

#### Read

What do you observe from this passage? How does it discuss faith and deeds?

#### Hear

Read this passage three times and listen to what God is saying to you.

# Meditate

How does this passage connect with your life experiences? What is it reminding you of?

#### Act

Determine to engage in "deeds" of mercy and commit to helping someone in physical need this week through your actions.

# Pray

Dear Lord, I understand that faith without deeds is dead. I pray that Your love fills my heart, and that Your Spirit opens my spiritual eyes and ears, making me sensitive to the needs of vulnerable people around me. May I commit to deeds of mercy and become a Christ follower who brings glory to You. I pray in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

How Does Holy Love Look Like In My Relationships? Day 13: 1 September 2023, Friday

# James 2:18-20

<sup>18</sup> But someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds."

Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds. <sup>19</sup> You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that—and shudder.

<sup>20</sup> You foolish person, do you want evidence that faith without deeds is useless?

## Read

What key words or phrases in this passage caught your attention?

#### Hear

What is God saying to you through this passage?

# Meditate

Reflect on whether your past actions have been driven by faith. How can you do better?

#### Act

Practice caring for others from the heart. Call someone who is weak in faith or has not yet believed in Jesus. Listen to their heart and pray for them.

# Pray

Dear Lord Jesus, thank you for coming from heaven to earth as the incarnate Word to save us sinners. How great You are! Please help me to imitate Christ and be willing to sacrifice myself for others. If there are any actions in my life that lack faith and love, remind me and help me to correct them so that I may have a positive and beautiful testimony in my life. I pray in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

# James 2:21-26

# Meditate

#### Act

Spend quiet time in the presence of God, reflecting on the passage, and create a list of faith-action combinations, Then, commit to putting them into practice.

# Pray

Faithful and gracious Lord, You teach us that faith and action go hand in hand, and we praise and thank You for this truth! Lord, I aspire to follow the example of faithful Abraham, to pursue holiness and live out a life of love that aligns with Your heart. Guide and assist me, Lord, to be a true friend on this journey of life, so that others may see Your grace and works through my life and give glory to You. I pray in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

# My Prayer

# James 3:1-2

## Hear

Read the passage silently again. Listen to what God is saying to you.

## Meditate

Why do you think God blesses believers? What is the relationship between God's blessings and acts of kindness? Finally, consider how you will respond to these insights.

## Act

Write down two specific actions that you can take to generously bless those around you. Commit to putting them into practice during the upcoming week.

# Pray

Merciful Heavenly Father, thank you for being a God who blesses abundantly. You command us to be generous, relying not on our limited abilities but on Your abundant grace. Soften our hardened hearts, Lord, and fill us with goodness and love. Move us to actively care for the poor, the orphaned, the widowed, and the vulnerable. #### Meditate

- a. Examine your heart. Is it focused on earthly wealth or on things of eternal and spiritual value?
- b. Reflect on the state of your spiritual life. Who is your master, God or Money?

#### Act

Begin each morning by reminding yourself first that the Lord Jehovah is your Master. Pray to Him, seeking His guidance throughout your day, and acknowledge Him as your Lord over every aspect of your life.

# Pray

Merciful Heavenly Father, thank You for reminding us that there is only one Master of our lives, and that is You. May Your light shine upon our hearts, directing our focus towards spiritual and eternal matters. Teach us to learn to store up treasures in heaven instead of pursuing material pleasures excessively. Help us, Lord, to prioritise You as the Lord of our lives, and to live according to the values and principles revealed in the Scriptures. Through faithful service and the righteous use of wealth for acts of kindness, may we reflect Your love and righteousness in our lives. In the name of Christ, we pray. Amen.

# My Prayer

# James 5:7-11

<sup>7</sup> Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting or the autumn and spring rains. 8 You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near. <sup>9</sup> Don't grumble against one another, brothers and sisters, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door!

<sup>10</sup> Brothers and sisters, as an example of patience in the face of suffering, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. <sup>11</sup> As you know, we count as blessed those who have persevered. You have heard of Job's perseverance and have seen what the Lord finally brought about. The Lord is full of compassion and mercy.

## Read

Read slowly and notice how the word "patient" is repeated in the passage. What other repeated words do you see?

#### Hear

What is God trying to remind you through this passage?

#### Meditate

Verse 9 says "Don't grumble against one another." Recall a time when you have grumbled about a fellow brother or sister in Christ. Consider the example of Job and how he remained faithful to God in the midst of suffering and accusations from his friends.

#### Act

Think of someone you need to be patient with, and make a conscious effort to be patient with them this week.

## Pray

God of peace, You have commanded us to love one another. Strengthen my heart, that I may be patient with others even when it is difficult to do so. May I learn to bear with one another in love with all humility and gentleness, eagerly maintaining the unity of the Spirit with the bond of peace. In the face of challenges and struggles, help me remain steadfast and faithful; that Your purposes may be fulfilled. In Jesus' name. Amen.

# **Romans 5:1-5**

#### Read

Read slowly and observe how Paul connects one idea to the next.

# Hear

Which word(s) or phrase stood out to you as you read? What is God telling you through this passage?

## Meditate

Verse 5 says that "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit." Reflect on how God's love has been poured into your life, bringing you joy and hope.

## Act

How can you rejoice in hope this week? If you are going through sufferings and difficulties, seek God for endurance to weather through.

# Pray

O Lord, your word reminds me that since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through Jesus. Thank you that I can stand in Your abundant grace and rejoice in hope because of Jesus. Grant me strength to persevere through hardships. I also pray for those who are suffering in body, mind and spirit (you may pray for specific individuals by name), asking for Your mercy and abiding presence in their lives. Pour forth Your love into our lives we pray, that we will go on to love those in our family and community. In Jesus' name. Amen.

# 2 Corinthians 4:16-18

<sup>16</sup> Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. <sup>17</sup> For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. <sup>18</sup> So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

#### Read

As you read, identify the contrasting words (e.g., outwardly and inwardly, wasting away and being renewed). What do these contrasting words remind us of what we should be focusing on?

#### Hear

What is God reminding you through this passage?

## Meditate

Verse 16 reminds us that while "outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day." Reflect on what this verse means for you in your current season of life. Spend time with God and allow Him to renew your inner self.

## Act

"Fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen" (v18). What is God prompting you to pay attention to?

## Pray

God of renewal, thank you for reminding me that the light and momentary troubles we face in our daily lives are preparing for us an eternal glory found in Christ that far outweighs them all. Abide me with Jesus and renew me day by day. Strengthen me so that I do not lose heart in this challenging world. Guide my eyes to focus not on things that the world encourages me to see, but on the things that matter to You, the things that have eternal significance. In Jesus' name. Amen.

# James 5:12-18

## Act

"Prayer is a powerful weapon even in the hands of the humblest believer, it does not require a 'super saint' to wield it effectively." In your small groups, confess your sins to each other and pray for each other.

# Pray

Heavenly Father, Your Word reminds us that a prayer offered in faith will heal the sick. So we lift up **(name)** in prayer, asking for their healing and restoration. Train me up in the discipline of prayer, remind me to come to You whether in happiness or in need. I confess my sins before You, asking for Your forgiveness and restoration through your Son. We pray in the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.

# 1 John 5:14-15

<sup>14</sup> This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. <sup>15</sup> And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him.

#### Read

Read the passage slowly and repeatedly. What condition does God require of us when we ask anything from Him?

#### Hear

What words of confidence is God speaking to you as you approach Him?

# Meditate

"It is by prayer that we seek God's will, embrace it and align ourselves with it." Ponder on verse 14. What is God's will for you in this season? Are you aligning to His will or are you trying to bend His will to yours?

# Act

Spend some time praying to God. Present your requests to Him and be assured that if you ask anything according to His will, He hears you.

# Pray

Our Father in heaven, holy is Your name! Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Forgive me for the times when I have been stubborn and disobedient to Your will. Soften my heart that I may catch a glimpse of Your purposes. I present my requests to You God, and may Your peace that surpasses all understanding guard my heart and mind in Christ Jesus. Amen.

Reaching out to a fellow brother or sister who has wandered from the truth is an act of holy love. Think of someone you know who has strayed. What practical ways can you reach out? Seek to reach out in the coming weeks.

O Lord, my heart is filled with thankfulness as I approach the conclusion of these 40 days of Bible reading. Thank you for Your Word that has taught, rebuked, corrected and trained me in righteousness. Grant me a heart of boldness and love as I reach out to family and friends who have wandered from Your truth. Reveal Your heart for the lost to me, and open up opportunities to start faith conversations with others. In Jesus' name. Amen.
