

Despite our aspirations to break free from the grip of COVID's tyranny, we find ourselves confronted by new challenges, including the rise of AI tools such as ChatGPT and geopolitical tensions exemplified by the Israel-Hamas conflict.

In this edition of Ripples from the Bay, our focus is on "Living Out Holy Love in a Turbulent World." As we navigate the uncertainties, Telok Ayer Chinese Methodist Church (TA) received the year-end announcement of pastor postings within the Chinese Annual Conference. These questions challenge us to re-evaluate our roles and contributions within the broader Christian community.

Sister Law Siok Niu draws from Jeremiah 3:22a and 6:16a, urging us to return from faithlessness and seek the ancient paths. She reminds us that all honour and power belong to the Lord, emphasizing wholehearted obedience and magnification of His presence throughout our lives. In the recognition that our Lord orchestrates everything, we find solace and refuge beneath His protective wings.


God's Provision is Marvelously Bountiful

Be shepherds of God's flock...
A self-introduction



It is a joy indeed to be given the opportunity to provide a short introduction for myself and my family, and I am honoured to be given the opportunity to serve the Lord at Telok Ayer Methodist Church from 2024 onwards.



I am Rev. Irman Halim (林恩信), a pastor with CAC for the past 11 years, having served for 3 years at Changi Methodist Church and 7 years with Hakka Methodist Church. 2023 has been my sabbatical year, where I had the opportunity to tour of and take a short course in Israel. The course has deepened my understanding and love for the Bible. As one of my lecturers liked to say, "Many say that being in the Holy Land makes the Bible become more alive to them, but I think the right saying is that it makes Us become more alive to the Bible".

I am married to Yun, and we have two children – Chloe is 14 years old and Caleb is 12 years old. We are quite a "rojak" family in that I am ethnically Chinese (born in Indonesia and now a Singaporean), my wife is Korean, and my kids are "confused" to say the least, having to juggle between Chinese, Korean, and occasionally, Indonesian cultures. But if you ask them, they will proudly tell you that they are true-blue Singaporeans!

In many ways, the word "rojak" also aptly describes my life journey, in that it has been filled with many different life experiences and challenges. Like many of us in the church, not only am I a 3rd generation Christian, but both my parents are Methodist pastors in Indonesia. Some of us in the Church might have met them before – they are Rev. Fajar Lim and Madam Tjoa Gek Tjin, who served the Indonesian service at Telok Ayer Methodist Church for a few years.

The turning point in my life came when I found Christ in the midst of a very difficult time in our family's journey. I accepted Christ to be my Lord and Saviour when I was 14 years old and subsequently dedicated my life to serving the Lord at a youth camp when I was 16 years old. The Lord honoured my desire to serve Him full time (this was not without its challenges! But that is another story for another day) and I have been serving in the Methodist Church upon my graduation from TTC in 2005.



TACMC is a church steeped in rich tradition and culture, and I am excited to be a part of this wonderful and vibrant community. As it will be my first year serving at Telok Ayer, I would like to observe and learn from the church, to eventually understand and discern God's working in the church. I look forward to serving and co-labouring with the members, leaders, and fellow pastors of Telok Ayer Methodist Church.

Above all, as I begin my ministry with the church I am once again reminded of my calling as a pastor by the writing of the apostle Peter in 1 Peter 5:2 – "Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve".

Indeed, let us continue to serve the Lord and one another in love and humility, and as we celebrate Christmas, may we look upon Christ, who "did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Amen.

Living out Holy Love in A Turbulent World

"But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong."

1 Corinthians 1:27

We are blessed in Singapore for having a wise and strong government. Our government policies have made our nation financially strong where home ownership is high and our median household income a month is over \$10,000 (based on Year 2022 data).

Many Singaporeans including Christians have amassed wealth and knowledge through our education system, job and business opportunities. Few have issues with daily needs like food, clean water, shelter, education and sanitation.

In comparison to much of the world, Singaporeans are indeed "wise" and "strong".

In March 2018, by God's grace, I visited Yangon, Myanmar with a non-Christian organisation to conduct a children's camp for about 350 children. This organisation primarily provides rice, basic amenities and education for the children as its vision is to help the children break out of the poverty cycle through education.

There were many orphans in Yangon. Natural disasters such as Cyclone Nargis in 2008, with a reported death rate of 138,000, aggravated the situation. Many of these orphans are homeless and left to fend for themselves on the streets.

In Yangon, I met Christians who do "foolish things" in life. These are people with no resources even to feed their own families and children and yet they provide care to orphans. They opened up their homes and took in orphans from the streets. They shared their homes and their food and gave their love and attention when they did not even have enough for themselves and their children.

They did "foolish things" that we Singaporeans wouldn't easily consider doing.

In the children's camp, I was able to attend their Christian worship session. The children's singing was the purest worship I have heard in a church setting.

Yet, it was a church with no air-conditioning and no chairs, and where the children were not nicely dressed. But it was a church with the voices of children singing and worshipping Jesus. It was a church which seemed to have nothing but yet had everything it needed.

Something in me changed after that trip. I had gone to Yangon thinking I was wise and strong. Yet I came away ashamed. I had not learnt to love "foolishly". I asked

myself, "Who has more faith? The man with all the daily bread he ever needs and yet holds tightly to his surpluses, or the man with almost nothing and yet still shares his home and resources with others in need?"

A question we may need to ask God is "Why do we belong to the church that seems to have everything and yet could have nothing?" Another question is "What do we do for the church that seems to have nothing but yet has everything?" If we profess to be followers of Christ, our church should have no "walls" and be all-inclusive, regardless of our financial status and resources.

In recent years, God also led me to World Vision Singapore, an organisation that reaches out to poor and needy children all across the globe. Child sponsorship has become an essential part of my life and truly I believe this is the thing God wills me to do.

I thank God for showing me these things in the world which have led me to change my view on money and to embark on child sponsorship with World Vision Singapore.

To live out Holy Love in a Turbulent World, we may need to do foolish things in life, where our actions are not based on worldly wisdom but on Godly love.

God's Wings of Refuge: My Testimony

I want to give glory to Almighty God who took me through a series of events concerning my health, and to testify to the grace and mercy God has lavished on me. Looking back now, I can only conclude that God has His hand in every detail of this incredible journey, fully covering me in body, mind, soul and spirit.

On the 10th of August, I was told I had lung cancer, and that I should have the tumour removed as soon as possible. My doctor promptly got an appointment for me to see the lung surgeon in five days. However, the PET scan and MRI for staging could not be done within those five days in the public hospital because of the long waiting list. God sent help in the person of a family friend who is an Oncologist in private practice. With his assistance, I had the two scans done at a private centre soon after. Much to our relief, the results showed no spread to other parts of the body.

Our moods were somewhat dampened, however, when told by the lung surgeon that the surgery could be done only six weeks later. So we considered going private, with various recommendations and options from our Oncologist friend. Then I was told by the lung surgeon that he was earnestly working towards bringing the surgery forward. I was then assigned a case manager, who made arrangements to have a battery of pre-operative tests done within a week so that I would be ready for surgery at a moment's notice. On 23rd August, I received news that I would be operated on the next day, exactly two weeks from the date of diagnosis. It seemed impossible at first. Who could have done it but our awesome God?

Subsequently, the lung surgery was successful under the divine hand of God. My recovery was largely uneventful, apart from the pain, and other discomfort associated with this type of surgery. At the post-operative review, the histology reports again confirmed there was no spread to other parts.

Right beside me every step of the way. He surrounded me with all the good people to make sure nothing went amiss, including the primary doctor who was vigilant enough to investigate my complaint, setting in motion the whole process that resulted in the best outcome I could have asked for. Catching it early was key. God orchestrated it.

It would not be true to say I did not go through an emotional roller coaster. From anxiety, confusion, and despair, to hope and relief. They were all there. But through it all, I never doubted God's infinite goodness, everlasting faithfulness and unfailing love for me. On the days leading up to the surgery, God spoke to me His words of comfort, encouragement and reassurance through the Scriptures and spiritual songs. In the interest of time, I will quote just two. From Ps 91:4 He will cover you with His feathers, and under His wings you will find refuge; His faithfulness will be your shield and rampart. From Isaiah 46:4 I am He who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you; I will rescue you. And many more! Indeed, it was an endless supply of God's rich

blessings and consolation. My cup runneth over.

While waiting to go into the operating room, I was left alone, but I knew that Jesus was with me, driving out all fears. I had the peace of God, right there in my heart! Before putting me to sleep, the anaesthetist told me not to worry, and that I was in good hands. I remember thinking to myself, I am in God's hand, which is far better. The next thing I knew, I was woken up and was told that it was all done.

When I was first diagnosed, I did not ask God 'why me?'. I understood that because of sin, it would have been more reasonable to ask 'why not me?'. But God has a purpose in all this, and I will not let my sufferings go to waste. Every day, I walk in confident trust in God's indescribable love for me. He met all my needs where they were and will continue to do so in the years to come. May God hold me fast and help me lean into His strength, come what may.

I would like to formally thank our pastors, our brothers and sisters in Christ as well as other friends who prayed for me, and showed me care, concern and kind support. Your prayers have made a huge difference. I've come to truly appreciate and value the power of prayer in our community, and the church, both within and without TA. I needed that. But God gets the highest honour. He is Jehovah Rapha, the God who heals. Jesus is my strength through the storm and over the storm. All glory to Him who reigns forever and ever!

Praise the Lord. Amen! Thank you.

In line with TACMC's theme of "Pursuing Holiness, Living out Holy Love," the TA English Service Discipleship and Nurture Committee held the course "Disciple III: Remember Who You Are" from February to October 2023. Over the 32 weeks. 13 participants met together every Tuesday from 7.30 pm to 10 pm and delved into the study of the relationship between memory and identity as observed in the Old Testament Prophets and the Letters of Paul. As a group, they explored the shared themes such as the calls to remember, to repent, of renewal, and the fostering of community bonds.



Below are some reflections shared by a few who had participated in the course.



Khoo Fun Ming:

Attending D3 class was almost like going through a tough course like Officer Cadet Training in SAF Training Institution... I reserved Tuesday nights for 32 weeks to attend the lessons and often had to beg off from business dinners when I travelled overseas. I found that the difference between reading the bible alone (where God often spoke to me personally) and studying the scriptures in a big group was that group study was a better way of understanding His word. In a group, the discipline of studying the Bible daily became a habit and I would feel guilty if I skipped any reading. Most importantly, D3 challenged me to read the Bible systematically as we also consulted Bible commentaries during individual study to seek further explanations and insights. All praise to God as we ended our final lesson with dinner and Holy Communion!

Gavin Chan:

A key takeaway for me was that the prophets' messages often focused on calling the people back to God, and emphasised the importance of repentance, righteousness, justice, and faithfulness. The prophets warned against idolatry, social injustices, and disobedience to God's commands, and predicted serious consequences if the people refused to repent and change their ways. Yet, they also conveyed hope and consolation through the promised restoration, redemption, and the coming of a future Messiah. The prophets and their prophecies remain relevant to this day, providing moral guidance and offering precious lessons for us on faith, accountability, and the pursuit of a just society.



The world today is full of chaos, violence and hatred, throwing Christians into confusion, hopelessness and discouragement. Often, our faith may be shaken too. Having gone through 32 weeks of D3, studying in depth God's messages delivered through OT prophets and Pauline letters, I gained new insights and a deeper understanding of how God shows us His faithfulness in fulfilling His covenant, spurring us to put on the armour of God individually and as a community of faith to fight against the evil in the world. Thus, it would be good if every church member, young and old, could join a Disciple class to equip themselves.

Lia Melinda:

I live in Indonesia and log into the Zoom session every week. I completed "Disciple I: Becoming Disciples through Bible Study" last year with my husband. This year, my daughter asked me why I was taking the D3 course. She said, "Mom, I saw you struggling with your research, reading the Bible endlessly, and saw your disappointment when you couldn't understand the task." Later, my son also asked me the same question. But here is why I persevered in the D3 journey....

During an assignment where we had to read about Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones (Ezekiel 37), representing people's spiritually dead condition, I realised that my own spiritual body had been akin to being in the ICU and could have died at any time. If I had not been brought to the spiritual hospital (i.e. church), and been cared for by the medical team (i.e. fellow believers) which was full of loving individuals who regularly provided me with spiritual support, I would have perished. My fellow D3 participants motivated me with their stories and inspired me with their unwavering belief in God. I can confidently say that the TA family has been like this spiritual hospital, and I am now spiritually

rejuvenated and fully alive by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. I see myself as clay, and God is my Potter. I have been born again to praise His name forever and He will use and empower me to spread His Gospel. Although it will be a long process, God will sanctify me through the Holy Spirit's guidance and enable me to put on new clothes of righteousness every day.

So, yes, I participated and continued in the D3 class because I want to be effective in sharing my faith with my family and friends, students, and neighbours. I want to pass down this faith to my children, daughterin-law, and especially to my granddaughter and future generations. I, Lia Melinda, a wife, mother, mother-in-law, and a "naynay", was once a stray sheep but I can now confidently say that I am a citizen of Heaven. I hope that my story of faith will inspire you to also take up a Disciple class in 2024 and that it will lead you to a truly fulfilling life by drawing you closer to God. Through these classes, you can receive the spiritual nourishment necessary for regeneration, which will enable you to love as Jesus has loved us.

Through this D3 course, I learnt that prophets are God's messengers, chosen by Him to remind others of His faithfulness and compassion despite their disobedience. For example, when Israel and its leaders repeatedly disobeyed God, the prophets reminded them to repent, return to God and stay faithful to their covenantal relationship with God. The prophets also brought hope to God's people, speaking of God's promise to send a Messiah who would save the world from sin. They remind us that God, with infinite compassion, will not be satisfied until the whole world is saved (Isaiah 45:22-23). From the stories of prophets, I learnt of the importance of offering God's compassionate and forgiving love to all people so that His salvation may reach the ends of the earth.

Progress Update of TA Restoration Work

Praise the Lord who blesses the Telok Ayer Chinese Methodist Church with two buildings, and nurtures multi-generations of believers through TA.

The renovation of TA 2 is completed, pending some minor patching of defects. This article provides an update on the progress of the restoration of our TA church building, a project that stands as a testament to our commitment to preserving and enhancing the sacred space where we gather to worship our Lord.

As you may be aware, the restoration project officially commenced on February 1, 2023, with a contract period of twelve months. However, we faced challenges in the initial stages, particularly delays in obtaining permits from the authorities. Additionally, unforeseen structural issues on Levels 1 and 2 and concerns with the

terrazzo floor necessitate a more comprehensive approach. Consequently, the completion date for the Temporary Occupation Permit (TOP) has been extended to the end of April 2024.

In the face of these challenges, we turn to the scriptures for guidance and solace. Proverbs 16:9 reminds us that "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps." We trust that despite the delays, the Lord is guiding this restoration project according to His divine plan, and we continue to place our faith in His perfect timing.

To address the additional requirements, we have diligently pursued avenues of support. With the assistance of our consultants and contractors, we submitted an urgent grant request to the National Heritage Board (NHB). We are pleased to

report that in October, we were informed the total revised fund granted is much higher than the previous grant. Praise the Lord for His abundant provision.

The restoration process involves various aspects, and we are pleased to share the progress of the ongoing works, various levels of the building are undergoing transformation:

Level 4 Demolition works and hacking of existing floors for the new lift core and waterproofing.

Level 3 Hacking of floors in toilets, nursing rooms, and the prayer room, along with the installation of electrical conduits, aircon ducts, and equipment.

Level 2 The removal of existing paint, laying of electrical conduits, and aircon ducts. Checking for hollowness of plaster and cracks.

Level 1 The demolition of existing toilets, removal of paint, and laying of electrical conduits. Checking for hollowness of plaster and cracks.

The external facade is undergoing the process of removing existing paint.

We are grateful for the hard work and dedication of our contractors, architects, and consultants who are diligently ensuring the quality and integrity of the restoration process. We seek your continual support to see through the restoration work.

Haggai 1:4,7-8 (NIV) reminded us:

4"Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your panelled houses, while this house remains a ruin?"... ⁷This is what the Lord Almighty says: "Give careful thought to your ways. ⁸Go up into the mountains and bring down timber and build my house, so that I may take pleasure in it and be honoured," says the Lord.

We look forward to your continued prayers, support, and patience as we navigate through this restoration journey. Together, as a community of believers, we look forward to the day when we can once again gather in our renewed and spiritually enriched sanctuary.
